THE CHURCH ORGAN - The work on the organ is now virtually complete, barring a few snags still to be corrected. But it is fully playable, and we will begin to use it over the next few weeks. Because it is Lent you are not likely to hear the full range of colours immediately, but it is sounding wonderful. We now again have a marvellous instrument to enhance our worship and because of the work that has been done on it will be available for generations to come to enjoy. The builder, Andrew Carter, and our organ consultant, Paul Hale, have worked tirelessly and meticulously to restore the instrument to its former glory and in the process have fixed a number of long-standing problems which made the instrument unreliable. Congratulations to them. Huge thanks also to Matthew and the PCC for their support and to everyone who has contributed so generously to the cost. Thank you also to Sarah Beardsmore for leading the fundraising effort. The church's musicians are very grateful for your support and are delighted to have our lovely organ back in use.

LENT STUDY COURSE - The season of Lent offers an opportunity intentionally to set a little time aside for reflection and study. This year's Lent Course will be based on the Bloomsbury Lent Book for 2021 '*Thy Will Be Done*' by Stephen Cherry, Dean of King's College, Cambridge. The book takes an in-depth look at the Lord's Prayer and uses six key words from the prayer as themes for reflection: Heaven, Earth, Bread, Temptation, Forgiveness, Glory. Everyone is very welcome. No previous experience of study courses is necessary! The sessions will include space for reflection, prayer and conversation based on the short chapters in each of the six topic areas mentioned above. We are delighted to be linking again with our friends at Nether Green Methodist Church who will be joining us for the course.
