Peter Heginbotham was born in 1976, and was educated at Solihull School. In 1994, he became Organ Scholar at Truro Cathedral, working under Andrew Nethsingha. Scholarships at Sheffield and Chester Cathedrals followed, during which time he studied with David Briggs and Gordon Stewart.

In 1999, he became Assistant Master of the Music at Sheffield Cathedral. During this time the choir made visits to Paris, Washington DC and the east coast of the USA, Germany and within the UK. He also made 7 CD recordings and has appeared on every national BBC Radio station apart from Radio 1. Until the fire in 2019, he was a regular visiting organist at Notre Dame de Paris with various choirs, and has played for the National Commemoration Service for the Liberation of Paris four times at Notre Dame.

As a recitalist, he has played in most cathedrals in the UK, including St Pauls and Westminster Abbey. As accompanist, he works regularly with groups including Sheffield Oratorio Chorus, Sheffield Chamber Choir and the Steel City Choristers. Nowadays, his proper job is as a police officer with South Yorkshire Police: as well as upholding the King's Peace, he has directed the Police Band at Doncaster Races and ran the SYP Male Voice Choir. He regularly plays for the choir at St John's Church Ranmoor, as well as at other churches within Sheffield.

Most of his spare time is taken up with entertaining his 8 year old twins, although he enjoys motoring and travel, as well as testing the results of other peoples' cooking.
