In which a prince, a philanthropist, 40 constables and a large dog go to church...


In October 1879 Royalty came to St John's. Prince Leopold (1853-1884), Queen Victoria's youngest son, was in Sheffield to open Firth College, a forerunner of the University of Sheffield. The Prince stayed at Oakbrook with the industrialist Mark Firth, who was, as its name suggests, the moving force behind the new college.
